



I. OBJECTIVE

1. To promote mass participation in the game of 3X3 basketball as a healthy and exciting sport of choice.

II. REGISTRATION

2. Categories

- 2.1 This competition is open to all teams; subjected to player eligibility and category capacity.
- 2.2 There are only 4 categories in this competition:

U19 Boys	Singapore citizen, PR and Student Pass aged between 14 to 19 years old only. (Born on or between 2003 and 2008)
U19 Girls	Singapore citizen, PR and Student Pass aged between 14 to 19 years old only. (Born on or between 2003 and 2008)
Men's Open	Singapore citizen or PR aged between 18 to 40 years old only. (Born on or between 2004 and 1982)
Women's Open	Singapore citizen or PR aged between 18 to 40 years old only. (Born on or between 2004 and 1982)

- 2.4 The capacity limit for U19 Boys will be 16 teams; U19 Girls will be 8 teams; Men's Open will be 24 teams; Women's Open will be 12 teams. All on a first-come-first-served basis.



3. Procedure

3.1 Registration for U19 Boys and Girls categories will commence on 14 November and will close on **28 Nov 2022, 5:00pm**.

Registration for Men's and Women's open categories will commence on 30 Nov 2022 and will close on **07 Dec 2022, 5.00pm**.

3.2 All players **MUST BE REGISTERED** in <https://play.fiba3x3.com> with a confirmed account. Only players registered with a confirmed account are eligible to play.

3.3 The following items must be submitted when making an entry. Teams will only have their place confirmed after all the required items below are submitted.

- Proof of a verified FIBA 3X3 account for all registered players
- Payment of the registration fees in full

3.4 Registration fee shall be \$50.

3.5 Payment Information:

- We accept credit & debit card payment via Stripe.
- You will be redirected to the payment gateway after completing your registration form.
- If you have missed the payment link. Visit <https://bit.ly/3is87an> to complete your payment.

3.6 Registration fee are non-refundable.

3.7 We reserved the rights to reject registration due to any of the following:

- Incorrect; false; inaccurate submission as required under item 3.3
- Submission after the closing date on 28 Nov 2022 (U19 Category) and 5 Dec 2022 (Open's Category) at 5.00pm

4. Player Eligibility

The team shall be responsible for the eligibility of the players at all times and shall bear the consequences of any infractions of the Regulations.



- 4.1 Players and officials who are currently banned by BAS or Scholar Group may not be registered by any team, unless the term of their suspension ends prior to the completion of the competition.
- 4.2 All players must be registered and have a valid FIBA 3X3 account.
- 4.3 All players must be Singapore Citizens or Singapore Permanent Residents possessing valid Singapore passport or pink/blue NRIC or hold a valid Student's Pass issue by ICA

III. DUTIES OF THE TEAM

5. Players

- 5.1 Only players who have duly registered are entitled to participate in the competition.
- 5.2 Once a player has registered under the team, he/she is not allowed to represent another registered team in the competition.
- 5.3 Each team is required to register 4 players, one of whom shall be the team captain.
- 5.4 Before the commencement of the competition, players shall be subjected to identity and age verification under the supervision of the game officials.
- 5.5 The team captain will be the sole point of contact for the team's administration or any other matters.

6. Coaches

- 6.1 No coach may be present on the playing courts and no coaching is allowed (remotely from the benches or otherwise).

IV. COMPETITION PROVISIONS

7. Insurance of Participants

- 7.1 The participating teams shall provide the necessary insurance coverage for their players.



7.2 The organizers and its agents shall not be responsible or in any way liable for any death, disabilities, injuries, loss of property or any other loss arising from any cause related to or in the course of competition.

8. Playing Uniforms

8.1 Teams must have a minimum of two sets of playing uniforms, with one set being light-colored (preferably white) and one set being dark-colored.

8.2 The team named first in the competition schedule shall wear their light uniforms and the team named second shall wear their dark uniforms.

8.3 All other aspects of playing uniforms shall conform to FIBA's Official 3X3 Basketball Rules 2021.

9. Competition Schedule

9.1 The competition will be scheduled on the following dates:

- Saturday, 10 Dec 2022 (Open Category)
- Sunday, 11 Dec 2022 (Open Category)
- Tuesday, 13 Dec 2022 (U19 Category)
- Wednesday, 14 Dec 2022 (U19 Category)
- Thursday, 15 Dec 2022 (U19 Category)
- Saturday, 17 Dec 2022 (Open Category)

9.2 Additional dates may be added if necessary. The confirmed dates will be finalized at the end of registration.

9.3 All participating teams undertake to play all of their matches until eliminated from the competition.

9.4 The organizers reserve the right to make changes to the competition schedule including the date and time of the matches as it considers necessary.

10. Competition Venue

10.1 All matches will be held at 3X3 Court at OCBC Square.



11. Competition Draw

- 11.1 Teams will be drawn into their respective pools based on the team's FIBA 3x3 ranking points. Team ranking points are the sum of the ranking points of the team's three highest ranked players.
- 11.2 In the event when there are insufficient teams with ranking points at the close of registration, the pools will be drawn randomly. The teams with ranking points will be seeded accordingly.
- 11.3 The competition schedule will be emailed to all team captains 3 days before the start of the competition.

12. Competition Format

- 12.1 The competition will be played with a pool phase followed by a bracket knockout phase.
- 12.2 For Open Category only, the top 2 of each pool will be drawn into the Super League, and the remaining teams will be drawn into the Prime League for the bracket phase.

V. AWARDS

13. Trophies & Medals

- 13.1 Individual medallions will be awarded to the players of the top 3 teams for both U19 and Open Category (Prime and Super League).

14. Prizes

- 14.1 Cash prizes will be awarded to the top 3 teams of the **U19 Category** and **Open Category (Super League only)** as follows:

- Champion - \$300
- Second - \$200
- Third - \$100



15. Prize Presentation Ceremony

- 15.1 The ceremony will take place at OCBC Square on the final day of the competition (U19 Category - 15 Dec 2022 and Open Category - 17 Dec 2022)
- 15.2 The top 3 teams of each category must attend the ceremony.
- 15.3 All players must be properly attired when attending the ceremony (team uniforms and covered shoes, no slippers or sandals are allowed).
- 15.4 Any defaulters of the item 15.2 will be referred to the Disciplinary Committee for further action.

VI. COMPETITION RULES

The competition will be conducted in accordance to FIBA's Official 3X3 Basketball Rules 2021.

16. Game Abandonment

- 16.1 In the event of unsafe or unforeseen circumstances, it shall be the decision of the referee to stop or terminate the match.
- 16.2 In the event of an abandoned game, the game time, score, and statistical records will be retained and continued when the match resumed at a later date and time.
- 16.3 In a rescheduled game, teams may only use players and team officials who were listed for the original game that was abandoned.

17. Protests

- 17.1 Teams that are protesting the result of their matches shall immediately at the end of the game inform the referee.
 - 1. The captain of that team shall, immediately at the end of the game, inform the referee that his team is protesting against the result of the game and sign the score sheet in the space marked 'Captain's Signature in Case of Protest'.
 - 2. To make this protest valid, it is necessary for the team to give confirmation of this protest in writing. This must be made within 20 minutes following the end of the game. It is sufficient to write, 'The team X protests against the result of the game between the teams X and Y'.



3. BAS must receive a detailed explanation on the grounds of protest and a deposit bond of S\$400 by the following day before 10.00am.
 4. If the protest is accepted, the security bond will be refunded.
 5. Should the team in question, or that of the opposing team, not be in agreement with the decision of the Technical Committee, it may then file an appeal to the Board of Appeal.
 6. To make this appeal valid, it must be made in writing, within 1 hour following the delivery of the decision of the Board of Appeal and be accompanied by a security deposit equivalent to S\$600.
 7. The Board of Appeal panel shall be convened to consider the appeal and its decision shall be final.

 8. Regardless of the result of the appeal, it shall be the decision of the Appeals Board to return all or part of the bond.
- 17.2 All other protests shall be submitted in writing to the organizers by 10am the following day of the match in question and followed up immediately with a full written report to be sent within 24 hours of the end of the match, otherwise they will be disregarded.
- 17.3 Teams are to continue with their scheduled matches whilst waiting for the result of their protest.

18. In Game Technical Decision(s)

- 18.1 Decisions made by the referees are final, and are not subject to review by video or other recordings, or other sources. The referees shall have the power to make decisions on any points not specifically covered in the Official 3X3 Rules of the Game and to interpret the intent and purpose thereof.

VII. DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

- 19.1 Any menacing, intimidation or acts of violence towards the opponents, referees, table officials, game supervisors or BAS and Scholar Group representatives may result in disciplinary action.
- 19.2 If a team commits an infraction for which it could be subject to disciplinary penalties, the team shall send a written report to the organizers the day following the game. Team captains have to ensure the team's good conduct at all time.
- 19.3 A fine of \$200 may be imposed on the teams that lost a game by forfeit, and the case may be referred to the Disciplinary Committee. A second forfeit by the team may result in the disqualification of the team from the competition.



- 19.4 Use of unregistered player(s) may result in the disqualification of the team from the competition and the team may be referred to the Disciplinary Committee.

VIII. OTHER RULES

- 20.1 While all reasonable precautions will be taken, BAS, Scholar Group, its staff and agents shall not be responsible or in any way liable for any death, disability, personal injury, loss of property, or any other loss arising from any cause related to or in the course of the competition.
- 20.2 In the event of any questions or matters arising out of any point, which is not expressly provided for in any of the rules governing the competition, the decision of the organizers shall be final.
- 20.3 The organizers reserve the rights to make changes, to add, delete and/or vary the said rules at any time as it considers necessary.
